Note 1: Although not stated as such a C2 / C6 / C1 / C0 would be the requirement as CN is non-slewing. Check with State Regulator

<u>Note 2:</u> Platform attachment recognition required on TH and Slewing TH's fitted with work platforms. WP Baskets must not be mounted to fork tines

<u>Note 3:</u> Jib or hook maximum capacity is determined by the combination of the TH and the attachment and rated as such on the related load chart.

All attachment combinations must be approved for use on the TH and the appropriate load charts provided

Legend: TH = Telescopic Handler

DOC = Duty of Care Training: eg. TSHA Gold Card, Nationally recognised Unit of Competence RIIHAN309D

CN = Licence: Non-slewing Crane over 3t # CN is the minimum required licence. Note

C2/C6/C1/C0 = Licence: Cranes, Slewing

WP = Licence: Elevating Work Platform Boom 11m & over

LF = Licence: Forklift

RCL/RCI = Rated Capacity Limiter/Indicator LSL/LSI = Longitudinal Stability Limiter/Indicator

MCL = Maximum Capacity Limiter
